## Programme Outcome of BA (Honours) in History under the prescribed syllabus of Gauhati University.

The Course Structure comprises of 6 semesters in which the Core Course contains a total of 14 Papers which includes the History of India, World History, European History and Assam History.

The Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AEC) consists of English and MIL Communication and Environmental Studies.

The Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) is created with Historical Tourism in North East India and Oral Culture and Oral History.

The Elective Discipline Specific Course (DSE) consists of 4 papers related to History of Assam.

Indian History is divided into 8 papers in Core Course which are :

History of India (Earliest Times to 300BCE)

History of India (BCE300 to 750)

History of India (CE750 to 1206)

History of India (CE1206 to 1550)

History of India (CE1550 to 1605)

History of India (CE1605to 1750)

History of India (CE1750 to 1857)

History of India (CE1857 to 1950)

Outcome: Students after completion of the Programme will be able explore the evolution of the Indian Civilisation, Culture, Socio -Economic patterns of Indian History during the Early and Ancient times. Students will also be able to explain the historical shifts, foundation of a new political conditions and varied administrative system introduced in the country during the Medieval period. They will also be able to analyse India's interaction with another wave of

foreign influence and the changes in brought in the social-cultural fabrics of the nation. While in the Modern period study, they will gather knowledge about the circumstances leading to establishment and consolidation of colonial rule and its consequences. Moreover the growth and rise of nationalism and nationalistic approach of the Indian can be visualized. They will also able to explain why resistance, uprising and active participation from all section of the people led to freedom movement and independence. Moreover they can brief the decolonization and nation building process of India.

World History Course is divided into 4 papers, which are as follows:

Social Formations and Cultural Patterns of Ancient World.

Social Formations and Cultural Patterns of Medieval World.

Rise of Modern West-I

Rise of Modern West-II

Outcome: Students will be able to gather knowledge and explain the process and stages of the evolution of the variety of cultural pattern and development from Bronze to Iron Age. They will also be able to explain about urbanization, slavery and development of democracy in Ancient World. Moreover from the second paper students can analyse about the social, political, economic, cultural, religious and administrative pattern of Modern World. Further, in the third and fourth paper, they can explain the major trends and development in Western World including decline of feudalism, Renaissance and Reformation and discoveries of new places. Students will be able to relate the circumstances and causal factors of the intellectual and revolutionary currents of Europe and America. They will also gather knowledge about the nation-state formation, new political ideology and economic shift.

European History Course is divided into two papers which are:

History of Modern Europe-I (1780-1939)

History of Modern Europe-II (1780-1939)

Outcome: After completion of the course, students will be able to evaluate the historical evolution and political development in between 1780-1939. Students can also be able to critically analyse the evolution of social classes, nation states, evolution of capitalism and nationalist sentiments in Europe. The can situate the historical developments of working class movements, socialist upsurge and the various causes and diplomatic affairs of the European nations in between the two wars.

**History of Assam** consists of 5 papers, out of which 4 papers are in the DSE course and 1 paper in the Core Course which are:

History of Assam (upto 1228)

History of Assam (1228-1826)

History of Assam (1826-1947)

Assam after Independence

Social and Economic History of Assam

Outcome: After completion of the course students will be acquainted with the major stages of developments in the political, social, cultural, economic and administrative history of Assam right from the Ancient period to Modern Period till the 90's. Including the early Kamrupa and Pragjyotishpur State, students will also learn in details about the longest ruling dynasty the Ahoms. From the arrival of the colonial power, the growth of Assamese language and identity can be learned by the students.
